

The Delhi High Court declined to set aside a family court order asking a husband to pay monthly maintenance of ₹75,000 to his wife and child, observing that the photographs presented by him to allege that she was living in adultery would have to be proven in trial.

The Madhya Pradesh High Court declined to quash a case against singer Neha Singh Rathore for tweeting a cartoon involving RSS shorts, related to a viral video showing a man urinating on a tribal laborer in Sidhi.



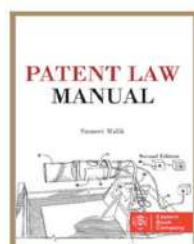
The Supreme Court mandated that advertisers or advertising agencies must submit a self-declaration certificate to the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MIB) via the 'Broadcast Sewa Portal' for TV ads and the 'Press Council of India' for print ads.

The Delhi High Court issued an ex-parte ad interim injunction against satirist Ravindra Kumar Choudhary from infringing the plaintiff's "India TV" and "Aap ki Adalat" trademarks and personality rights by using "Baap ki Adalat" and "Jhandiya TV."



The Digital Media Content Regulatory Council (DMCRC) has advised OTT platforms to exercise caution in content creation, avoid unjustified vulgarity and obscenity, and uphold social responsibility.

The Delhi High Court has stopped the Punjab-based food chain 'Donito's' from using Domino's trademark for selling pizzas and burgers. Justice Anish Dayal ordered Donito's to remove all references to Domino's from its domain.



The Delhi High Court has asked the Patents Office to update its manual to help Examiners and Controllers handle new AI and machine learning technologies.
