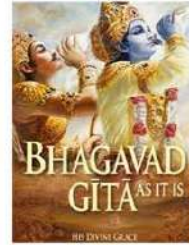

Passcode Hospitality Pvt. Ltd. ordered to pay INR 15,00,000 for using sound recordings without permission. Despite fee hike disputes, court allowed continue usage upon payment.



Google fined Rs. 1 Lakh for undisclosed European Patent Office (EPO) foreign patent rejection, which was dismissed due to lack of inventive steps. Appeal against refusal cites lack of inventive step and novelty.



Delhi HC orders defence ministry to decide on including women in armed forces through CDS exam. Despite SC allowing women in NDA, CDS practice still discriminatory. Plea emphasises barriers to female officers' career growth.
