InterDigital files patent infringement case against OPPO: Delhi HC orders OPPO, interim deposit and imposes INR 5,00,000/- cost for delaying proceedings in case of Interdigital technology corp. & ors. vs. Guangdong OPPO mobile Ltd. & ors.



MakeMyTrip filed a Special leave petition against Google for allegedly allowing Booking.com to use its trademark as a Google Adword. The Supreme Court ruled in favor of Booking.com, stating no trademark infringement due to lack of confusion.



Patanjali Ayurved apologized to the Supreme Court for misleading ads about its medicines. The court had directed Baba Ramdev and Acharya Balkrishna to appear on 2 April for not responding to a contempt notice



The Supreme Court has invalidated the State Bank of India's electoral bonds scheme, indicating that the scheme is unconstitutional.
