Biopic Dispute: Court denies Injunction against the release of the biopic on Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee as plaintiff fails to establish basis on exclusive book rights.

Delhi High Court has granted interim injunction in favour of aviation training institution against Maritime Travels Pvt. Ltd. in **trademark dispute** regarding the use of the copied term 'Fly Hi'.





Mumbai Court rejects CBI plea seeking stay on release of Netflix series on Indrani Mukerjea case, the prime accused in the Sheena Bora murder case.

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MORTH) has advised states to clarify that motorcycle taxies are eligible for contract carriage and can operate as transport vehicles.





The Supreme Court ruled that terminating a female officer based on marriage grounds is arbitrary. The Union is directed to pay Rs 60 lakh as compensation to a former military nurse.

Delhi High Court allow an appeal against a refused patent for a suspension coll spring, citing insufficient reasoning on prior art's obviousness, stating that the mere citation of prior arts do not suffice to establish obviousness.







Justice Anish Dayal of the Delhi High Court expressed concerns about the impact of artificial intelligence on the judicial system, stating that the courts face a challenging time as judges may find it difficult to trust the evidence presented before them.
