

January, 2024 LEGAL RECAP

The Supreme Court had ruled that the caste or religion of parties should not be mentioned in any filings before the Courts.



Review petitions have been filed against the Supreme Court's recent decision that upheld the abrogation of Article 370. The Supreme Court decision supported the central Government move to revoke Article 370



In a trademark dispute involving 'Blenders Pride' and 'London Pride,' the High Court of Madhya Pradesh refuse to issue a temporary injunction against the use of the 'London Pride' trademark citing the only significant similar feature is the word 'PRIDE'.



The Delhi High Court granted a permanent injunction against the owners of deceptive domain names (www.croma-share.com, www.croma-2.com, www.croma-3.com) for using the renowned mark "Croma" in fake parttime job recruitment scams.



The Delhi High Court had ordered WhatsApp and Telegram to act against fraudulent groups using Sequoia Capital's name in the Sequoia Capital Operations LLC v John Doe case.







In Bilkis Bano gangrape case, the Supreme Court had quashed the Gujarat Government's decision to allow the premature release of 11 convicts.



The Supreme Court has imposed a cost of Rs. 25 Lakh on a litigant for filing criminal proceedings in a civil dispute.



The division bench of Delhi High Court has set aside an order passed by single judge which upheld the order passed by PPV & FR Authority revoking Pepsico India's registration with respect to a potato variety used for making Lay's chips.





The Supreme Court haS introduced a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for summoning Government officials.
